A 60 YEAR OLD MYTH RESOLVED

My first posting after Trade Training, was to the Isle of Wight, exact location, Ventnor. The camp was on two sites, the domestic site was on the higher part of the town, whilst the working part of the camp was a subterranean radar station on St Boniface Down. My job was, with the help of a couple of other dog handlers, to patrol the ground level of the site, which contained aerials and state of the art radar equipment. Whilst we patrolled the top, all the work was being done underground.

One day a rumour went around the camp that "an object" had been tracked by the radar operators crossing the south of England from east to west, at speeds of over 1000 mph. This was soon dismissed as a 'bit of a lark' put out by some duty operators with nothing to do. This story was to become one of those myths you tell your grand children, when you want to embroider your military life.

The other evening I was 'surfing the net' looking for a story for this magazine when I can across a story headed "Analysis of Radar & Radarvisual sightings R.A.F. Ventnor, Isle of Wight. This is a report on the events of some 60 years ago.

Fact or Fiction?

The report told of the event of the tale we had been told all that time ago In the report the speed of over 1000 mph is quashed. Well that was a bit of an exaggeration.

The report gives 860 - 920 mph. The report concludes in summary, *if the intercepted object really did achieve radar-tracked speed approaching* 800 knots (920 mph) then it was not a Hunter, neither was it any operational jet in R.A.F. Service at this time. From the requirement that winds were slight or zero up to around 30,000 ft to account for the 'balloons' near stationary around that time it can also be inferred that there was probably no significant component of tail wind. And remember that this recorded ground speed is a minimum since the PPI only shows the lateral component of the target speed minus any vertical component

due to climb or drive. If the Ventnor radar report is wrong then the object could have been a Hunter, but evidence that the radar report is wrong is lacking. It is also of interest that according to the Odiham report Mission 48 did not acquire AI radar contact on the object even though its range was four miles inside the pickup range for a fighter proven during PI exercises immediately beforehand.

In short it isn't possible to be confident about what the object(s) may or may not have been.

I now know that the tales that went around the camp that day some 60 years ago were true, but what was that "THING" they followed across the skies of southern England? I'll leave that one to you and your imagination.

I have now learnt that it did hit the press later, but by that time I was on my way to the Far East, so wasn't aware that the incident was in the open.
