WINGS APPEAL 2015

WINGS APPEAL 2015 had been planned well ahead with all Store collection dates confirmed, and 248 Sqn ATC Squadron participation agreed. For the month of September the branch organised the R.A.F. Ensign to be flown at Letchworth and Baldock War memorials, and at Hitchin Town Hall.

Fortunately Cyril Grey was well prepared for his stint at the Stotfold Co-operative despite this collection starting on a Bank Holiday Monday, and surviving a clash with Dogs for the Blind charity

Once again a well done Cyril, who must be by now our "ACE" collector with a total amounting to £433.95

Despite new document requirements created by Sainsbury's the collection for Sat 5th Sept. went very well.

Many thanks to the record numbers of members in attendance, for the £611.44 collected.

A meeting with 1066 Sqn. Hitchin in early August highlighted their desire to collect for WINGS Appeal in Hitchin area. Enquiries at ASDA was NO ...only bag packing and the Poppy Appeal.

Managed to obtain a date for Salisbury's Hitchin via their P.R. Liaison member . Alas this was a non event due to the Salvation Army turning up having been given the same date as the R.A.F. Association.

A bitter disappointment for the cadets of 1066 sqn ATC of Hitchin.

The Store manager agreeing to the Salvation Army whilst I had gone through the new channels by getting confirmation of the date from the PR for Charity Collections assigned to the above a member of staff.

Letchworth Garden Square Shopping Centre collection was eventually cancelled due to insufficient members available to man the stall, also it clashed with a WINGS

collection by R.A.F. Henlow in Hitchin Market place which we supported. The charity benefited from the £xx.xx collected.

Battle of Britain Day commemoration service took place at the Letchworth W.M. Our thanks to members and 248 ATC Squadron Letchworth for their participation. This was repeated in the afternoon at 1500 hrs at the Hitchin W.M. with 1066 ATC Squadron in attendance. This year was the first for me to stand in for the late John Stoddard to provide the Battle of Britain Eulogy.

Morrison's of Letchworth two day collection was cancelled by the company admin in Mid September on instructions from their Head office. So 248 ATC Letchworth squadron were denied the chance to emulate their yearly contribution.

The R.A.F. Association H.Q. have mailed Morrison's re this country wide cancellation.

In fact Morrison's early in September declared Sept 15th Battle of Britain day in their stores country wide.

I personally enquired on the 16th Sept at the Letchworth store how their day had gone, only to met blank stares as they been given no instructions from their management.

Lunch was taken in the combined Mess Hall with a walk around the oil paintings in the Officers Mess Ante Room. The afternoon was spent around the R.A.F. Scampton Heritage Centre where the focus was 617 Sqn The Dambusters. Branch members were able sit at Wg Cdr Guy Gibson's desk in his actual office when he was Officer Commanding. To top off a superb day the Red Arrows Aerobatic Display Team were practicing all day outside the hangar and in the air.



DEDICATION SERVICE

STOTFOLD CEMETERY WAR MEMORIAL ON 29TH OCTOBER 2015 TO MARK THE ADDITION OF R.A.F. FLIGHT SERGEANT THOMAS W. CHELLEW GM NAME TO THE WAR MEMORIAL

After69 years of campaigning by the Chellew family to have his name on the War Memorial, the campaign was taken up by the Stotfold & Arlesey Branch of the Royal British Legion at the request of Mr David Chellew, son, on behalf of the family.

Flight Sergeant Chellew died, whilst in service, shortly after the end of the WW2, having served in the Far East where he contracted a disease which resulted in his death in a UK military hospital.

He was buried in Stotfold Cemetery in a CWGC grave as a casualty of War within the designated 'time frame'.

The RBL Branch established documentation evidence that the name qualified to be placed on the Memorial. The Stotfold Town Council, being the War Memorial Trustees, accepted the evidence presented by the Branch to warrant his name being added.

His name has recently been added and this Dedication Service gives witness to this in the presence of representatives from R.A.F. Henlow (where he was stationed before WW2), local Branches of the Royal Air Forces Association, Royal Naval Association, Royal Anglian Regiment and Branches of the RBL Bedfordshire County.

Stotfold Mayor, Alan Cooper and RBL Bedfordshire County Chairman, Eric Robinson also joined Mr David Chellew and his family.

The service of Dedication was conducted by the Revd. Bill Britt of the Stotfold St. Mary's Church. During the service, John Street of the Stotfold Salvation Army played The Last Post and the Reveille after the silence, followed by Wreath Laying by R.A.F Henlow and the RBL Stotfold & Arlesey Branch.

The Service was well attended by the local Community.
